


I want to use a film clip...

- 3. Material will be delivered as part of a scheduled course, under the direction of an instructor, and access will be limited only to students registered for that course.
- 4. Material is directly related to the subject of the course.
- 5. You will use:
 - a. part or all of non-dramatic musical or literary works, or
 - b. reasonable and limited portions of all other works.
- 6. The work from which you are taking the content is a legal copy.
